

Mississippi's Automotive Industry

Mississippi manufactures more than 500,000 vehicles annually

Home to Toyota and Nissan automotive assembly plants, Mississippi produces more than 500,000 vehicles annually. The state's automotive ecosystem, which includes more than 200 suppliers, generates more than \$3.2 billion each year in gross regional product. Additionally, Mississippi ranks in the top ten states for manufacturing light-duty trucks and tires.

Mississippi supplies a robust pipeline of technical talent

Automotive producers require a range of workforce skills needs in Mississippi, and the state delivers. Mississippi has over 18,000 students enrolled in STEM degree programs at its four-year, Tier I research universities. Mississippi's 15 community colleges offer two-year degree programs in automotive technology, which are structured around Automotive Service Excellence certification competencies. Toyota's Advanced Manufacturing Technician program provides paid, hands-on apprenticeships in conjunction with classroom instruction for students at a consortium of north Mississippi community colleges. The state also offers custom workforce training solutions through four specialized facilities dedicated to advanced manufacturing technology training, including 12,000 square feet of manufacturing space at the Haley Barbour Center for Manufacturing Excellence at the University of Mississippi.

Mississippi is a leader in automotive sector R&D

Mississippi's automotive ecosystem includes renowned research and development centers at its top universities. The Center for Advanced Vehicular Systems at Mississippi State University performs sponsored interdisciplinary research and engineers new automotive systems technologies. The Mississippi Polymer Institute at the University of Southern Mississippi offers industry partners a variety of advanced materials innovation services.

100 million people are within a day's drive

Located at the core of the Southern Automotive Corridor, Mississippi is within a day of trucking to major population centers encompassing more than 100 million people. The global logistics hub of Memphis, Tennessee, is conveniently located just across Mississippi's northern border, giving producers the agility to respond to business demand anywhere and anytime.



\$2.4 billion in transportation-related equipment freight flows through Mississippi

Transportation equipment products generate over \$2.4 billion of annual freight flow across Mississippi's transportation network. Overall, Mississippi handles \$322 billion and 457 million tons in freight flow annually. Mississippi offers producers multi-modal and inter-modal shipping options, including six U.S. interstates, 14 U.S. highways, five Class I railroads, and 15 ports (including two deep-water ports,) which producers can use to move goods quickly to market.

Extensive raw materials

Mississippi provides producers with abundant, costeffective access to natural resources commonly used in industrial processes, including extensive endowments of ground water, surface water, sand and gravel, and stone quarries available for industrial usage.

More than \$858M in annual non-tire motor vehicle exports

From 2018-2020, Mississippi businesses exported an annual average of more than \$858 million in non-tire motor vehicle products, including an annual average of \$572 million in passenger vehicles. Mississippi also exports \$12 million in tires per year. Canada is Mississippi's largest motor vehicle export country destination, receiving on average more than \$718 million in automotive exports annually.
